# APVC 2025 Speaker Sponsorship Opportunities Appendix

- 1. Email registration forms as soon as possible. Every year potential exhibitors are turned away from exhibiting at APVC due to restricted space. APVC committee also completed a delegate survey in 2024 to better understand the exhibitor category interest level from the delegates perspective, and we will consider this data when making exhibitor participation decisions moving forward.
- 2. Understanding that loyalty to APVC over time and sponsorship level offered matter, booths are granted first based on exhibitor category fit, then to sponsors at the platinum, gold and silver levels, then to exhibitors who have been with us in the past, and fourth to new registrants. New registrants will be considered, first on exhibitor category fit, secondly on sponsorship level and thirdly on an earliest registration submission basis. Having exhibited the previous year doesn't automatically guarantee participation the following year as per the above conditions, and if you send in your registration and there isn't an available booth space, your company will be placed on a waiting list for this year's conference. Payment will not be processed until booth space is available.
- 3. Once approved for participation your sponsorship ranking will be determined solely by the total sponsorship commitment value. A company sponsoring \$11,000 will have sponsorship opportunity priority over a company sponsoring \$10,000, even though both are classified as platinum sponsors, and therefore be provided the opportunity of first selection of their sponsorship choices, followed by the second ranked sponsor and so on. Speaker and other sponsorship opportunities selected (see associated document) are combined to determine sponsorship ranking.
- 4. Sponsors will be granted prime locations in the exhibit areas.

#### Bio

Stephen Niño Cital is a multi-credentialed veterinary technician specialist with a passion for anesthesia, pain management, and cannabinoid medicine. He has authored numerous articles and contributed to several textbooks, including acting as the lead editor for the first cannabinoid medicine textbook, and the second edition of a pain management textbook expected to be released in 2024. He has many exciting professional highlights but some of his favorites include being part of the scientific team that discovered the acidic cannabinoid forms are absorbed in higher concentrations when consumed orally, discovered a common drug used in anesthesia causes a serious complication known as methemoglobinemia in monkeys, invented a smaller and more practical blood filter for animals during blood transfusions, and gained title protection for veterinary technician specialists. Stephen is the COO of the Veterinary Anesthesia Nerds, LLC, co-founder of the Veterinary Cannabinoid Academy, and Executive Director of the Academy of Laboratory Animal Veterinary Technicians and Nurses. He is a lab manager at Stanford University in the department of neurobiology in addition to the Chief Veterinary Specialists. Stephen is an advocate for credentialed veterinary technicians and veterinary technician specialists as well as the BIPOC community.
